In Mexico, 7 out of 10 children suffer from tooth decay, 1 in 5 face emotional challenges, and millions grow up without real access to healthcare

(ENSAUIT 2016, UNICEF 2021, INEGI / CONEVAL 2022)

In San Miguel de Allende, there are more than 500 communities, yet only around 200 have access to a school. In many of these areas, having a health center is nearly impossible, and reaching one often requires significant time and cost.

That is why, when Patronato Pro Niños arrives with its mobile units—often more than an hour and a half away from the city center—we do more than provide medical, dental, and psychological care.

We bring high-quality services directly to underserved communities through a minimal fee of just \$10 pesos per consultation, eliminating economic barriers for families.

In doing so, we do not only treat illnesses—we transform lives by delivering preventive healthcare to children in vulnerable communities. This model is made possible by individual donations that sustain the majority of our operations.

Our History:

1970

A group called “Friends of the Children” is formed in the San Antonio neighborhood to support 28 children in education and health. Meanwhile Stirling Dickinson had begun helping children in communities surrounding San Miguel.

1974

The two groups came together to formally establish Patronato Pro Niños de San Miguel de Allende A.C.

2006

The first mobile unit begins operations.

2007

The organization receives authorization from SAT as a certified nonprofit (donataria autorizada).

2008

The first clinic is built in San Miguel de Allende.

2020

Operating 5 mobile medical/dental units when the pandemic temporarily shut down schools and its operations. We continue paying its doctors to be able to restart full operations as soon as possible.

2025

Started providing psychology services in the campo where the need was identified due to escalating increases in suicide, drug abuse, among other serious issues.

What does Patronato Pro Niños do?

We provide medical, dental, and psychological care to children from 1 month to 17 years living in rural communities around San Miguel de Allende who lack healthcare insurance or the financial means to pay for such care.

Through our clinic and five mobile units operating Monday through Friday from 7:00 am to 1:00 pm, we serve more than 70 children per day.

Our goal is for each child to achieve full health. All treatments, medications and dental-care education and products are provided to the children

If specialized care is required, the child first is referred to our social worker, who helps the family secure the needed care, through the General Hospital of San Miguel de Allende or other providers.

New Mobile Unit



Thanks to a generous donation given in memory of former board member Jane Sallis, we added a new mobile unit, which replaced a 2011 vehicle whose operation had become costly and limited our reach.

This investment not only optimizes resources but significantly expands our ability to serve more children in communities where healthcare simply does not exist.

For the first time, this unit includes a dedicated psychological consultation space, directly addressing an urgent need expressed by teachers and families: the emotional well-being of children and adolescents.

Today, thanks to this support:

- We reach communities where psychological care had never existed
- We identify and treat cases requiring specialized follow-up
- We ensure continuity of care through our clinic

This progress was also made possible through the support of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship San Miguel de Allende (UUF SMA) and Amistad Canada, among others.



Impact Story

One of our 36 special cases we support

Emily was born in 2021 and, just months later, was diagnosed with a complex heart condition that required multiple surgeries and a long hospitalization.

Against all odds, her strength—and that of her family—allowed her to move forward, though with significant health and developmental challenges.

In 2025, Patronato Pro Niños, through our special-needs program, supported Emily and her family by covering transportation costs to specialized consultations, essential medical supplies, and continuous follow-up.

Today, Emily continues to make progress. She has begun taking small steps, can eat some foods, and finds joy in music—something that makes her dance.

Her story reflects not only resilience, but also the tangible impact that access to timely care and support can have on a child and her family.



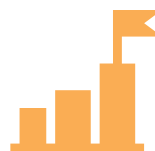

Financial Report

2025 was a year of consolidation, with total income of \$7.48 million pesos, coming from a diversified base:

- Programs: 38%
- Events: 30%
- Individual donations: 14%

The dental program represented approximately 48% of total expenses, reflecting its scale and impact.

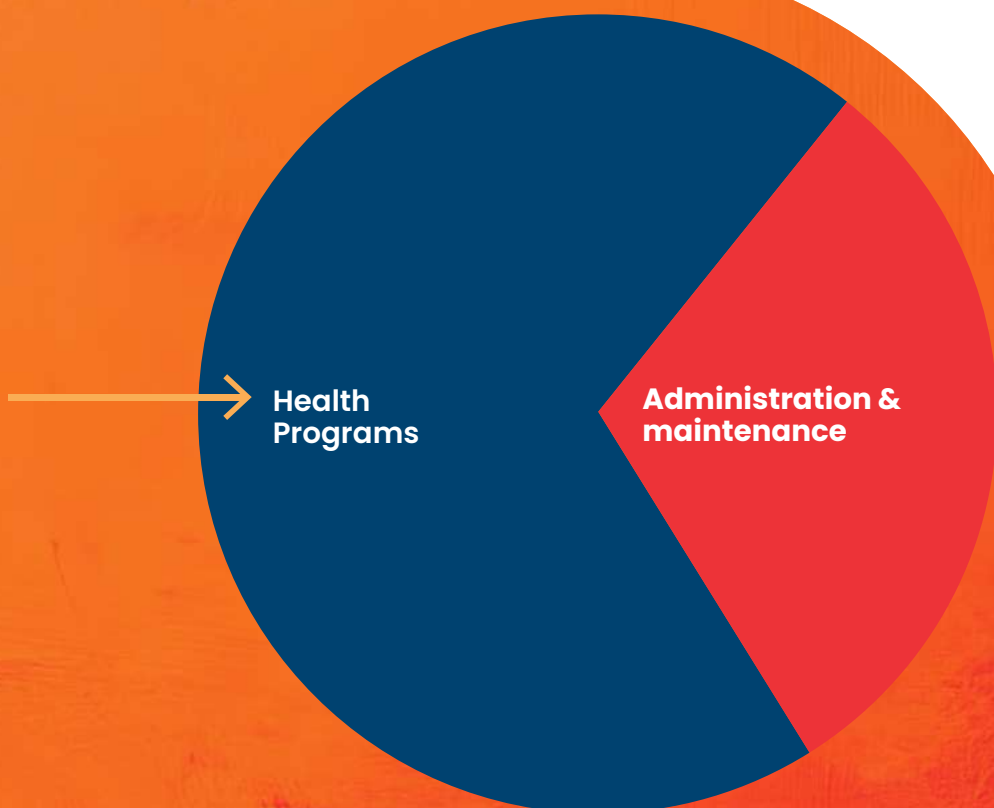
Total expenses: \$7.43 million pesos
